Management of Exposure to Blood or other Body Fluids All actions within 1 hour of incident:

First Aid Treatment should be carried out immediately if any individual sustains a Significant Exposure

First Aid Treatment

- 1. Encourage wounds to bleed by gentle squeezing;
- 2. Wash thoroughly with liquid soap and warm running water **do not** scrub the wound;
- 3. Cover wound with a clean dry dressing;
- 4. Irrigate eye or mouth splashes thoroughly with warm water or saline;

5. Do not swallow the water used for rinsing out mouth;

6. If required medical advice should be sought;

Injured Medical Student Sustaining Injury/Exposure Must Immediately

1. Take prompt first aid action;

2. Report the incident to your Educational Supervisor/Undergraduate co-ordinator/ Ward or Theatre Clinical Personnel or charge nurse as appropriate dependent upon where the injury took place.

3. If risk assessment of the incident indicates a 'significant injury' attend Occupational Health Service 08.30 – 17.00 hours Monday to Friday, or if Occupational Health is unavailable, please attend the Emergency Department

On attending the above please ensure the following information is available:

- 1. Name, date of birth and contact details of the injured person;
- 2 Details of the injury;
- 3 All available information about the source of the injury
- 4 Hepatitis- B immunisation status of injured person (if known).
- 5. Request that the person to whom you reported the incident raises an Incident Reporting Form
- (IR1) and ensure that a senior member of staff completes the Source Patient Risk forms.
